Background

Purpose: Getting the best knowledge and practice on resilience used to shape policies, plans and investments to deliver a resilient future.

- Co-created with partners and co-led by ICCCAD/LUCCC, CDKN/SSN, GRP.
- Scope: Initially climate and COVID-19 but will cover all shocks and risks.
- Currently over 400 members from over 100 organizations.
- Supporter to Race2Resilience, Sister to Adaptation Research Alliance.
- Funded by USAID and Sida.

Functions of the Resilience Knowledge Coalition

Collaborate

Peer-to-peer learning, networking and capacity building

Connect

Agile online platforms and virtual spaces for knowledge sharing and convening

Apply

Incubating solutions, synthesizing evidence and getting knowledge into use

Collaborate

Peer-to-peer learning, networking and capacity building:

- Establishing a vibrant Community of Practice
- Organizing webinars, convenings and a biennial event
- Global South Expert and Talent Pools pilots
- Small grants to incentivize cross-event collaboration

Connect

Agile online platforms and virtual spaces for knowledge sharing and convening:

- Online inventory of resilience expertise and evidence
- Virtual collaboration spaces
- Dynamic linking of online platforms

Apply

Getting knowledge into use through measurement, incubation and scaling support:

- Monitoring, Evaluation and Learning (MEL) support
- Incubation, acceleration and scaling support
- Prizes to surface bold ideas for getting knowledge used

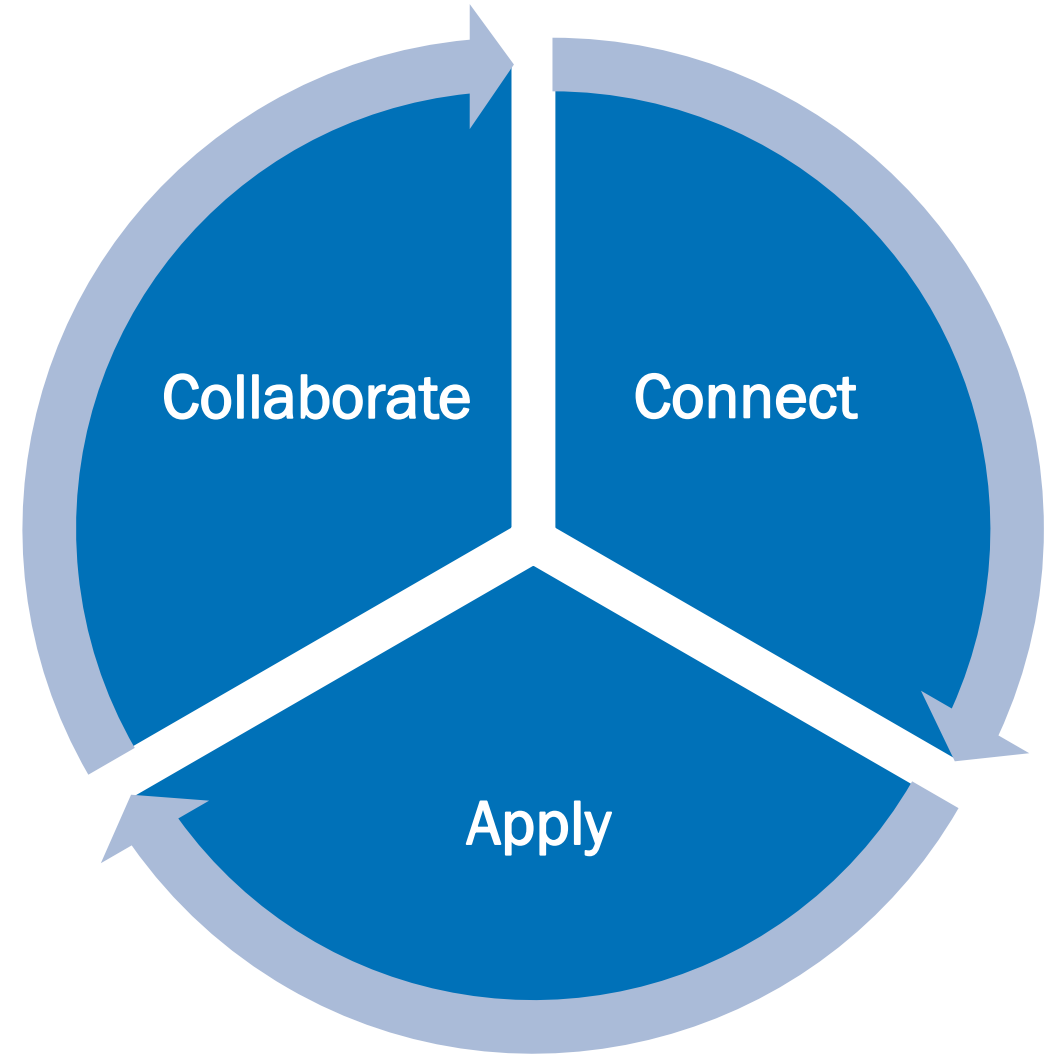
Break-out groups (20mins)
