





# Terms of Reference Resilience Knowledge Coalition Global South Talent Pool

Position: GRP Innovation and Scaling Internship

**Duration:** Full time (up to 6 months)

Start date: 1 August 2021

Compensation: USD 800 per month

## **INTRODUCTION**

The Resilience Knowledge Coalition is hosted by the Global Resilience Partnership (GRP) and coled by the Climate Development Knowledge Network (CDKN) and the International Centre for Climate Change and Development (ICCCAD). Our purpose is: Getting the best knowledge and practice on resilience used to shape policies, plans and investments to deliver a resilient future.

#### **ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

GRP is hiring an intern who will work as part of the GRP Secretariat. The GRP Secretariat is a small, diverse international team that convenes and catalyses actions by the Partners. The intern will be home-based. This internship position will support GRP's <u>Innovation and Scaling</u> work. A significant portion of time will be focused on supporting the work with existing and new initiatives the GRP engages with, as well as taking a supporting role in work around various matchmaking events. The main responsibilities of the intern will be as follows:

- Review and quality assure content from
- Ongoing meta-analysis of resilience expertise (organizations, networks and people) and opportunities (funding, trainings, courses).
- Collate, curate and analyse innovation, development and the cross cutting space between the two.
- Support coalition member needs assessment around innovation and scaling and review of ongoing initiatives.
- Collaborate on webinars and periodic updates for match making events.
- Logistical support / assisting in organizing webinars, training events, meetings and other events
- Any other tasks that the team may assign.

## **ASSESSMENT**

The candidate will be assessed on the following:

- 1. The candidate should have completed a degree in a relevant discipline with 0-2 years of experience and be younger than 35.
- 2. The candidate should be a national of a country eligible for Official Development Assistance as defined by the OECD-DAC¹.
- 3. Experience with innovation and mentoring.
- 4. Experience from project work and/or start up in a senior role.
- 5. The candidate should have a personal laptop and an internet connection.
- 6. Interest in and understanding of resilience and international development cooperation.
- 7. Excellent ability to express themselves in English. Additional languages an asset.

#### TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT

The period of employment will be for 6 months, with a one-month probation period. This is a full-time position aimed at gaining professional working experience. This opportunity is **not** aimed at or suitable for students seeking to complete a research project as part of their course work. Up to

1 day in a week can be spend on capacity development (training, research, events). No funding will be provided for these capacity building activities.

The proposed compensation is USD 800 per month. Other benefits include access to virtual spaces for collaboration, a certificate of completion as well as networking opportunities and alumni groups. The candidate should have a personal laptop and an internet connection, as this will **not** be provided. The candidate will be paid 50 USD (included in the remuneration) as a compensation for using their own laptop and internet connection.

No travel is foreseen for this activity. Interns may be sponsored to attend events virtually where relevant (e.g., CBA). The only exception is where travel fits within specific responsibilities and additional funding is available to cover travel costs. There will be limited opportunities for continuing internally after the end of the assignment. References can be provided to prospective employers based on conduct. A certification letter will be provided on successful completion of the internship.
